WRITING GUIDELINES

Writing Submission Guidelines

- Writing entries may include prose, poetry, drama, or research writing.
- Writing entries may be emailed, mailed, or picked up from school.
- Pieces may be created individually, in a small group or class.
 - *Each participant must complete and submit a separate entry form.
- Only ONE entry per student or group will be accepted.
- Entries must be accompanied by a completed entry form for each participant.

Content

- Entries must relate to the contest theme.
- Each entry must be rooted in the Holocaust.
- All copyright-protected sources must be cited on a citation page. This includes books, magazines, films, photographs, web sites, and works of art, among others.
 - *no specific format necessary for citations just record sources used on separate page.
 - *Highly recommended to use our provided resources at AkronSummitHolocaustEducation.org.

Length

- Entries limited to 400 words, excluding cited sources.
- All entries must be on one page only (excluding cited sources).

Format

- Entry must be on one page only (8 ½”x11”), excluding cited sources.
- Do not put student name on writing piece; either paper clip entry form to or put name in subject line.
- Use of creative fonts and layouts are accepted.

Curated Exhibit

- Displayed pieces will be chosen based on interpretation of the contest theme, rooted in Holocaust, technique, originality and use of proper sources.
- Chosen pieces will be displayed at the Akron-Summit Main Library in the spring and online at AkronSummitHolocaustEducation.org.
- All participants will receive a certificate; chosen pieces will receive special certificate and recognition.

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VISUAL ART GUIDELINES

Visual Art Submission Guidelines

- Entries must relate to the contest theme.
- Entries must be accompanied by a completed entry form.
- Only ONE entry per student or group will be accepted.
- Pieces may be created individually, in a small group or as a class.
 - *Each participant must complete and submit a separate entry form.
- All copyright-protected sources used must be cited. This includes books, magazines, web sites, and works of art, among others. All photos/clippings used in piece should be source cited.
 - *no specific format necessary for citations record sources.
 - *Highly recommended to use our provided resources at AkronSummitHolocaustEducation.org.
- Visual Art entries may be mailed or arrangements made for pick up at school.

Format

- Any medium may be used.
- Do not mat work.
- Must be on 12"x12" paper (scrapbook paper is 12"x12" but can use any type of paper)

Dimensions

- 2-dimensional pieces only accepted.
- Submissions must be 12x12 inches.

Curated Exhibit

- Displayed pieces will be chosen based on interpretation of the contest theme, rooted in Holocaust, technique, originality and use of proper sources.
- Chosen pieces will be collaged by board members and displayed at the Akron-Summit Main Library in the spring and online at AkronSummitHolocaustEducation.org.
- All participants will receive a certificate; chosen pieces will receive special certificate and recognition.
